History (concept - Disasters)

This will be our main subject focus this term as we are learning about 'The Great Fire of London' that happened in 1666.



We will find out how it happened and who the most important people involved were. As part of our Topic we will also burn the houses we make so we have a first-hand understanding of how the people at the time may have felt.

Maths

Year 1

Measure Length and Height

To use the language related to the subject: longer/shorter, taller/smaller and double/half.

To begin to use a ruler.

Geometry and Shape

To recognise and name common 2-D and 3-D shapes, including: 2-D shapes [for example, rectangles (including squares), circles and triangles] 3-D shapes [for example, cuboids (including cubes), pyramids and spheres]. Also, to be able to relate these to real-world objects.

Fractions

To recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

To recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

Year 2

Measure Length and Height

To measure length/height in any direction (Meters and Centimetres). Using a ruler correctly and reliably to measure in CM.

To begin to estimate length and height and choose the correct unit of measurement to do so.

Geometry and Shape

Identify and describe the properties of 2-D shapes, including the number of sides and line of symmetry.

Identify and describe the properties of 3-D shapes, including the number of edges, vertices and faces.

Identify 2-D shapes on the surface of 3-D shapes, [for example, a circle on a cylinder and a triangle on a pyramid].

Compare and sort common 2-D and 3-D shapes and everyday objects.

Fractions

To recognise, find, name and write fractions 1/3, 1/4, 1/4 and 1/4 of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity.

Write simple fractions for example, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$.

Art & Design (ICT)

We will create some Great fire of London art based on James Weston Lewis' illustrations.

These will be created digitally on the iPads using 'Sketches Schools' (a dedicated digital art App).
