RPr: We held a Maths evening for parents of KS2 children to show what we are studying. Very few parents attended. JR: Parents who attended found the session useful.

Reading diary has a section with the mathematical vocabulary and information that we use.

FM .ls it better to get correct vocabulary terms used, in early, Early Years for example?

JR: Would it be worth getting the parents in at KS1 to explain the vocabulary used in maths? Get more parents in from all year groups?

RP: said he would look at a possible Parent Information Evening for EYFS and KS1 to develop vocabulary.

GD: Explained that the school should be aiming to achieve ARE above national averages. Target to get every child to the national average.

HIAS Hampshire Maths Team and LLP have been working alongside us with supporting our maths.

The development of the teaching of Arithmetic has been a key area of improvement within the school. Rebecca Vickers (Hampshire Maths Team) is very impressed with the progress being made and the way we are tackling this. We are challenging our children.

Rev Alex: What is happening to children who are not where they should be with their maths?

GD: We are using in class and out of class interventions; we have seen gaps so we are working on this. After school booster clubs have also helped with Year 6. We have support staff who are giving invaluable support at the moment.

CP: What changed and why do we have to do these interventions?

GD: Last year's data posed a few questions. Was it cohort specific or did
