



Primary School PE and Sport funding 2023/24

Hurstbourne Tarrant CoE Primary School

Vision: 1. Fund high quality PE and sport for at least 2 hours per week, complimented by a wide range of extracurricular sport and competitive opportunities. 2. Provide equal access to sport for boys and girls.

Key Areas: 1. Increase all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport. 2. Increase engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport. 3. Raise the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement. 4. Offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils. 5. Increase participation in competitive sport.
